The campus recently completed a \$13 million building and renovation project. In June 2000, a 55,760 square foot building was completed which houses a library, theatre, music rooms, large group instruction areas, and a commons.

UW-Fox Valley in Menasha is one of 13 campuses of the UW Colleges. With its convenient location in the Fox Cities, UWFox provides local residents with the opportunity to obtain a University of Wisconsin degree. The campus is among the most modern in the UW System, with major campus renovations completed in 1991, 1997 and 2002. The 1997 construction resulted in the creation of Wisconsin's most technologically advanced undergraduate science laboratories. 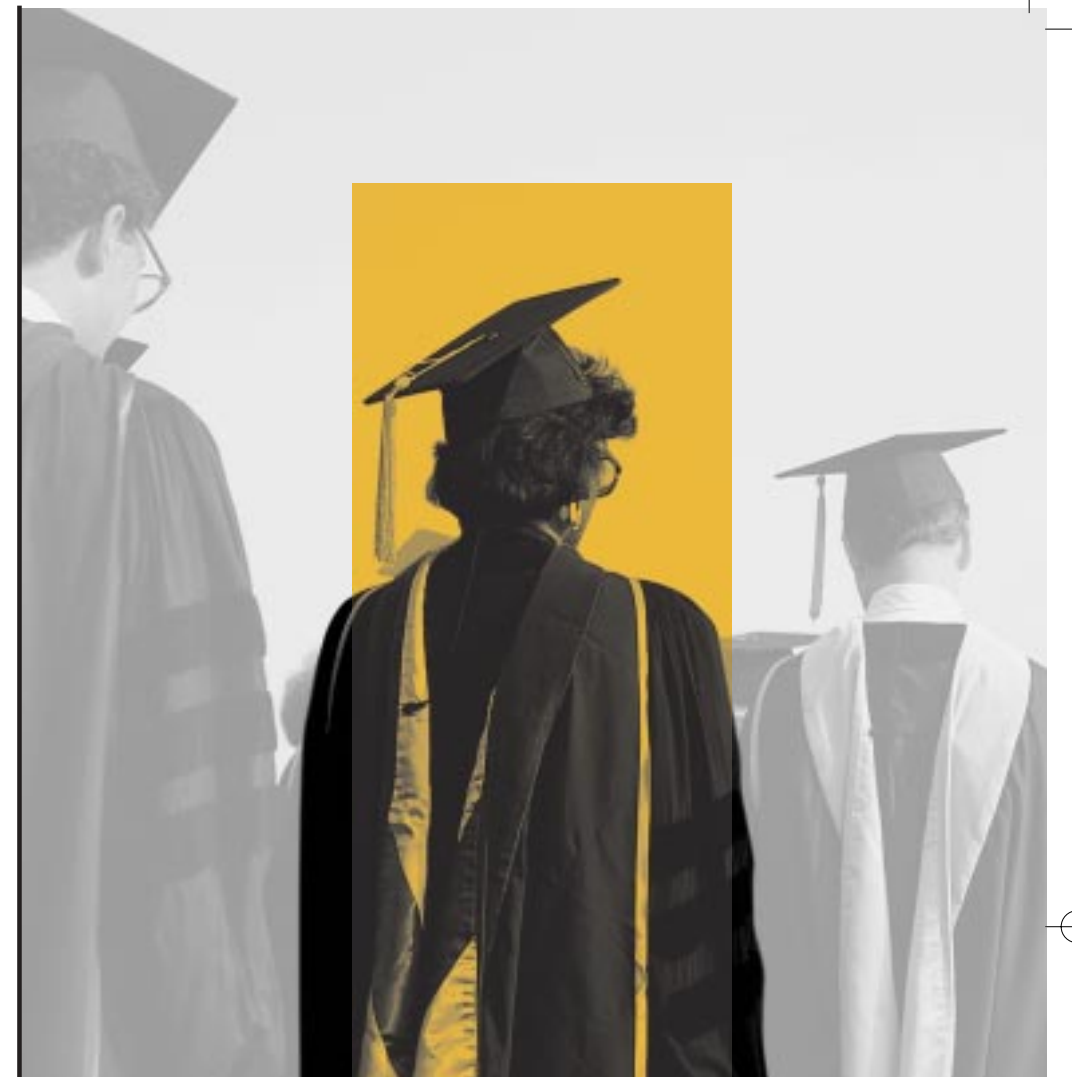

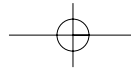

THE ORGANIZATIONAL ADMINISTRATION DEGREE

PRE-CORE COURSES

To meet the needs of an ever-changing population of students, a new degree emphasis in Organizational Administration has been added to the UW Oshkosh Liberal Studies degree program. UW-Fond du Lac, UW-Fox Valley and UW Oshkosh have collaborated to offer a Bachelor's Degree to students throughout the greater Fox Valley area. Specifically designed with working students in mind, this easily accessible, interdisciplinary emphasis is designed to instill in its graduates the "art of getting things done through people." By combining coursework in a variety of disciplines, students will develop the interpersonal skills, business awareness and communication expertise required for a wide variety of career choices.

Organizational Administration courses will be offered in the late afternoon and evening on the UW-Fond du Lac, UW-Fox Valley and UW Oshkosh campuses. Most courses will be taught on simultaneous evenings on the three campuses via a combination of on-site instruction and interactive distance delivery.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants who seek admission to the Organizational Administration program are subject to the admissions policies of UW Oshkosh, UW-Fond du Lac and UW-Fox Valley.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To earn a Bachelor's Degree, students must complete a minimum of 120 credits, and fulfill the general degree requirements listed in the UW Oshkosh Undergraduate Bulletin. An Associate of Arts and Science Degree from UW-Fond du Lac or UW-Fox Valley will satisfy general education requirements for the Bachelor's Degree.

The Organizational Administration program is comprised of pre-core (fundamental) and core (Organizational Administration) courses. Most pre-core and core courses can be taken concurrently. (Please see the enclosed insert for course descriptions.)
